GLOBAL SERVANT LEADERS / ISTANBUL CULTURAL AMBASSADORS PROGRAM 2010

In honor of Istanbul's selection as Europe's Culture Capital for 2010, Young Guru Academy (YGA) has been implementing the Global Servant Leaders / Istanbul Cultural Ambassadors Program since 2007.

Each year, YGA invites university students and NGO leaders from different countries to Istanbul for a 10 day cultural program to introduce Istanbul, Turkish culture and Turkish cuisine through tours of the city, visits to historical and cultural places, demonstrations of Turkish music, dance and art providing the participants with an unforgettable cultural experience.

Upon returning to their countries, the participants are expected to promote Istanbul and the Turkish culture at their universities, or at their organizations or volunteer for one of the sponsoring NGO's.

The participants will stay at the homes of YGA graduates.

The participants will be accompanied by YGA graduates on the daily activities.

The program includes visits to historical and cultural places, cooking Turkish food with a Turkish chef, Turkish art demonstrations and attend music shows.

The participants will also attend YGA's leadership camp in Saklikoy. They will participate in leadership workshops given by Turkish leaders and share their own social change projects with YGA students.

Program Cost:

Participation fee per attendee is \$950 payable to YGA.

Young Guru Academy will cover all meals, accommodations, transportation fees in Istanbul, all cultural and historical tour fees, and Saklikoy leadership camp fees.

The American Turkish Society will sponsor 2 participant's roundtrip airline tickets from New York.

Young Guru Academy will sponsor 1 participant's roundtrip airline ticket from North Carolina.
